

We will continue our Tricentennial Celebration with an exploration of the German influences on New Orleans along with hosting activities that celebrate all things Fall!

DAILY EXPLORATIONS (TUESDAYS-FRIDAYS)

TODDLER TIME 10:00 a.m. in First Adventures

Pretend to run your very own German bakery and roll & bake “dough” into breads or king cakes! Explore the textures of the harvest with an apple and potato stamping activity, by drumming on pumpkins, and by touching their ooey-goeey insides (or feel them through a mess-free squishy bag)!

Special: Boo in Toddler Time! Come dressed in a costume from **October 30-November 2** to make your own squishy monster and collect small “prizes” to put in your trick or treat baggie!

Did you know that German bakeries in New Orleans have been making yummy treats for more than a hundred years? Become a baker, follow the recipe, measure and mix ingredients to make your very own dough!

Celebrate the history of German culture in New Orleans by trying out Germany’s favorite sport: soccer! Get moving with fun games and challenges for all ages.

Learn a German folk dance based on Hansel and Gretel, sample salted soft pretzels and apple strudel, and go on a storytelling adventure through our Fairy Tale Forest with Golden Key volunteers from the University of New Orleans!



October 20th: Riverboat John Visits LCM! 11:30 am – 1:30 p.m.

Join us for special river-related story times with singer and storyteller “Riverboat John” Ferguson. He will recount iconic river stories and songs that are important to American culture. His visit at LCM is part of the programming for RiverWorks Discovery, a traveling exhibit at LCM through December 16.

October 27th: SUPER SCIENCE SATURDAY: Science is Out of This World! 11:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Discover chemistry that is “Out of This World” during Super Science Saturday, which culminates National Chemistry Week. Sponsored by the American Chemical Society Louisiana Chapter, this day brings more than 10 college science organizations to LCM to explore everything imaginable (and unimaginable) about chemistry. Space-themed costumes are encouraged!

NOVEMBER

During this month of Thanksgiving in this special year of New Orleans 300th birthday, we give thanks to all who have made New Orleans what it is today. This month, we will celebrate even earlier cultural influences than those of the last 300 years and explore the Native American tribes who were the first inhabitants here.

DAILY EXPLORATIONS (TUESDAYS-FRIDAYS)

TODDLER TIME 10:00 a.m. in First Adventures

Enjoy sensory explorations inspired by Native American and seasonal traditions. Explore the sounds of drums, big and small. Practice threading colorful beads to make your own necklace or bracelet. Build a kinetic sand turkey with silly eyes and feathers, and “feed” the hungry turkey with pom poms!



STORY TIME 10:30 a.m. (Wednesday – Friday), 3:00 p.m. (Tuesday)

Native Americans have used the stars and constellations as a traditional part of storytelling. Explore the night sky and enjoy star-inspired myths and legends from diverse indigenous cultures, especially our local tribes, the Choctaw, Houma, and Chitimacha.

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) 11:00 a.m.

What are you thankful for? Contribute to our “Gratitude Graph” to share and compare with others who feel thankful too! Use microscopes and magnifying glasses to look at the natural materials commonly used by local Native American Tribes, such as milkweed and marsh grasses, corn and sugarcane.

HEALTH & WELLNESS 11:30 a.m.

Get ready for harvest season by learning about the crops grown by Louisiana’s Native American tribes, and explore the many ways we use them today.

DAILY EXPLORATIONS (TUESDAYS-FRIDAYS)

TODDLER TIME 10:00 a.m. in First Adventures

NOLA winter brings cold weather but warm lights! Enjoy clicking a flashlight on and off while “lighting up” dark areas of the museum. Build structures with wooden kiva planks inspired by the Cajun river bonfires, paint with ice cubes and scoop ice around in our cold winter sensory bin! Listen to cold winter wind sounds and explore sticky contact paper while giving a polar bear his white fur.

STORY TIME 10:30 a.m. (Wednesday – Friday), 3:00 p.m. (Tuesday)

New Orleans is a city built on many cultures and traditions, and December is a particularly special month of celebrations. Listen to stories about these festivities during Story Time, including books like “Lights of Winter” and “Winter Candle”.

City Park update

If you have visited City Park recently, you are likely aware that construction for LCM in City Park is in full swing. To date, the superstructures for both North and South Wings have been completed, the first plantings of native grasses to restore the lagoon edge are flourishing and three bio islands have been floated to support local habitat including fish in the shadows below and ducks and birds nesting above.

Currently, the Grand Stairway that ascends through the glass-enclosed Bollinger Atrium to the second floor of the exhibit wing is taking shape. Over the next few months, you will see the green moisture barrier currently visible on the building exterior covered with the permanent siding, the windows fully installed, and the roof completed.

Meanwhile, in workshops here in New Orleans and in Ohio and New Jersey, a reimagined landscape of interactive exhibits, along with a few beloved favorites, is being fabricated. We look forward to welcoming you and your family this time next year to create a work of art in the "Make your Mark" gallery, and journey along the Mighty Mississippi' from its headwaters to the Gulf of Mexico in "Move with the River" as well as play in familiar territory in a new grocery store and bubble exhibit.
